Location

The newly developed South Boston Waterfront neighbourhood, or Seaport District as it's also known as, has vibrant bars, a luxury cinema, a dandy of a bowling alley, and restaurants of all stripes; from the high-end Michelin-starred Menton to the all-vegan By Chloe. Situated on Seaport Boulevard, Yotel Boston is caught in the middle of the old and the new; the burgeoning seaport's skyscrapers are laid out to its front; while Fort Point's old brick warehouses - now trendy offices, apartments, and restaurants - lie to the rear.

The Harborwalk and the fabulously futuristic Institute of Contemporary Arts are both a short stroll away. Seaport Boulevard runs from Atlantic Avenue and the Rose Kennedy Greenway, all the way through to the tented waterside outdoor music venue, known as Harbor Lights when it opened in 1999. The Court House MBTA (T) station is adjacent to YOTEL Boston.

Style & character

As with much of the Seaport's new architecture, Yotel's exterior is unremarkable. However, step inside this mid-rise building and the bright, breezy Mod design is fun and functional.



6/10 Service & facilities

The lobby has self-check-in terminals, but there's a friendly human on hand 24/7 nearby at the small front desk, known as Mission Control. There's a 24-hour fitness centre and the Club Lounge has lots of charging points, adding a good workspace.

7/10 Rooms

As first-class air travel inspired this now-international chain, rooms are called cabins and designed to pack as many utilitarian features in as small and comfortable space as possible - and the rooms are small. An all-white palette, and automatically adjustable beds that shorten to couch length, give a more spacious feel. There's an abundance of charging points and a wall mounted television.

The open-plan bathrooms have glass-walled showers and toilet separated from the cramped vanity area. YOTEL's bespoke toiletries are excellent, with a lovely floral smell. The room isn't designed for staying in: rather it's more sleep, shower, and get out and about.

7/10 Food & drink

Dining is offered all day in the lobby Club Lounge, which also has a central bar with great street views: perfect for drinks. The indoor-outdoor 12th-floor Sky Lounge and its terrace with skyline views of the Financial District are very popular for after-work to late-night drinks and small bites.

The Club Lounge has free coffee 24/7. There's a small terrace off the lounge. Menus are as well curated as the rooms: the à la carte breakfast is especially good. All dishes are the same price, which includes pastries, coffee or tea, and juice: try the tasty Mediterranean egg skillet: eggs, potato, roasted tomato, onion, and Parmesan baked in a cast iron skillet.

7/10 Value for money

Double rooms from \$149 (£112) in low season; and from \$219 (£165) in high. Breakfast not included, costs \$16 (£12). Free Wi-Fi.

Access for guests with disabilities?

There is access for guests with disabilities and adapted rooms.

Family-friendly?

There are interconnecting rooms; some rooms have a bunk bed above the main bed.
